



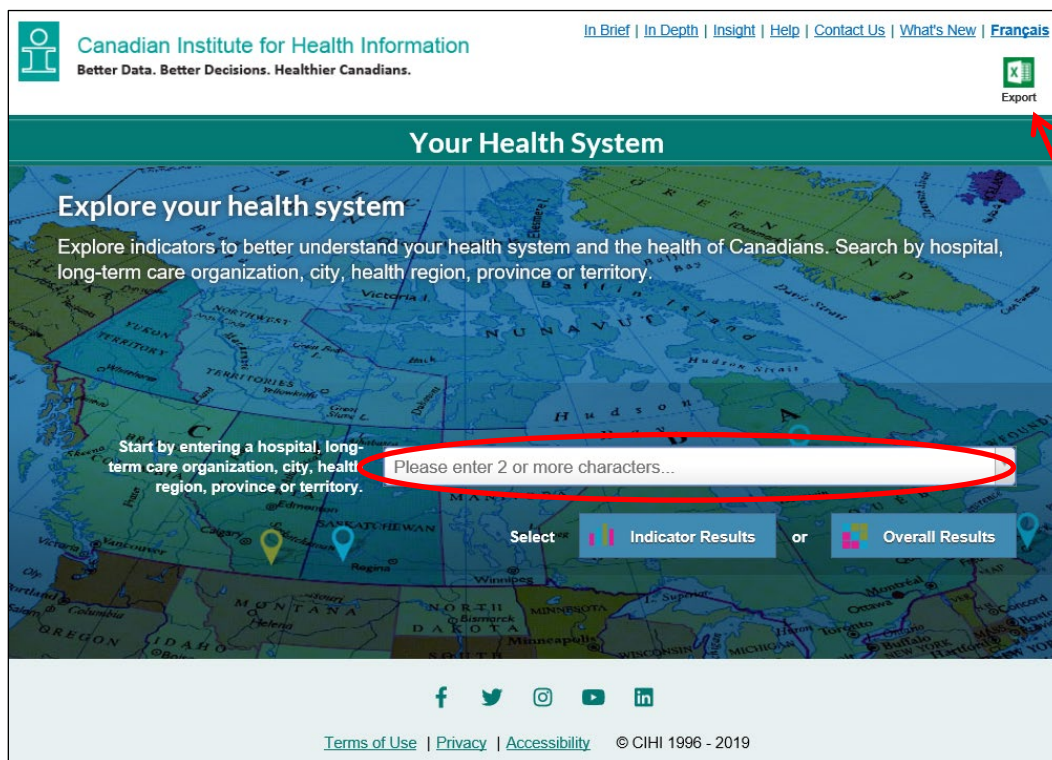
Accessing Indicator Results on Your Health System: In Depth
