<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All different prescribed and over-the-counter medications that were taken in the last seven days (NOT number of doses) • Medications given by all routes • All daily, PRN and STAT doses that were actually given • Self-administered medications • All medications given outside the facility • Topicals, vitamins, eye drops, ointments, patches, creams used in wound care and herbal medications • Fleet enemas, suppositories, mineral oil and bowel preps (Go-Lytely, Cirtro Mag) • All medications added to IV, TPN and CADD pump (such as KCL) • Therapeutic doses of heparin • Long-acting medications prescribed on a maintenance schedule (such as antipsychotic medications, vitamin B12 and chemotherapeutic agents) given outside of the seven-day observation period • Vaccinations and antigens 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Medications ordered but not given in the last seven days (except long-acting medications) • Nutritional supplements (such as Ensure, Boost, Sustacal and Resource 2.0) • TPN solution, IV solution • Same medication with a different trade name • Oxygen, alcohol • Heparin as part of a heparin lock system to keep the vein open • Topical preparations used for preventive skin care (such as moisturizers, moisture barriers and disinfectants) • Medicated dressings
